Minor Ailments Scheme

The minor ailment scheme is designed to enable anyone with minor health conditions to access medicines and advice that they would otherwise visit their doctor for. You will be able to speak to a qualified health professional, at convenient and accessible times and places.

The scheme is designed to reduce your waiting time for a doctor's appointment and to reduce the number of valuable A&E spots that are being taken up with minor illnesses.

Childhood illnesses that may be treated under the scheme include:

- colds
- coughs
- diarrhoea
- earache
- hay fever
- head lice
- nappy rash

- mouth ulcers
- high temp or fever
- conjunctivitis
- constipation
- indigestion
- teething
- sore throat

<u>Allergies</u>

This is just a reminder that some children at Whitehall infants suffer with severe nut allergies, and as such no children are allowed to bring nuts into school with them. Please ensure that you are not providing nuts as a snack or part of your child's lunch during school time.

30-hour childcare

From September 2017, working parents will be entitled to receive 30 hours of free childcare for their three or four year old child (from the term after their child's third birthday).

The additional hours will be available where both parents are working (or the sole parent is working in a lone parent family), each parent earns at least the equivalent of 16 hours a week at the national minimum or living wage and less than £100,000 a year. The school is currently looking into whether any changes to our current provision are to be considered. To support this, a consultation is being held by the London Borough of Hillingdon to see what demand locally there will be for this. Your responses will help to inform the planning that will be done to prepare for this.
