Please do not bring any nuts onto the school premises as some of our children have allergies.



#### Can you spot Chicken Pox?

We have had a few cases of Chicken Pox in school over the past few weeks.

Mrs Castle-Mason would ask that parents keep a look out for the following signs:

- **spots** red raised spots develop on the face or chest before spreading to other parts of the body.
- blisters over the next few hours, very itchy fluid-filled blisters develop on top of the spots.
- scabs and crusts after a further few days, the blisters dry out and scab over to form a crust; the crusts then gradually fall off by themselves over the next week or two.

If your child has Chicken Pox, you should prevent it from spreading by keeping your child from school until the last blisters have scabbed over.

Pop down to your local library and enjoy the range of books!


