Attendance and Welfare

It is very important that your child attends school every day. If your child will not be in, please remember to call the absence line by 8:30am on **01895 590112 option 1** every day that your child is absent.

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school or nursery when they are unwell.

We follow the government guidelines to determine how long a child should stay at home. The most common queries are in the table below

Vomiting and / or Diarrhoea	Your child should stay at home for 48 hours after their symptoms have stopped.			
Sore Throat	Your child can still come to school however if they have a high temperature they should remain at home			
Head Lice / Nits	Your child should attend school but their hair should be treated.			
Coughs and Colds	It is fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or cold. If they have a high temperature they should remain at home.			

Safeguarding reminders

- Please keep your child with you during drop off and pick up. It can become very busy and we would not want your child to become separated from you.
- Ensure your child is dropped and collected by an adult.
- If you have changed your phone number, address or email address please let us know as soon as possible by emailing office@mail.whitehallinf.org
- Please inform us of any court orders or injunctions preventing someone from collecting your child.
- Please provide legal documentation for any safeguarding issues relating to your child.
- Remember to regularly check our website or app for important information.

Parents of **only junior school children** (not families with children in both schools) **must drop off and pick up** their children from the field entrance on Whitehall Road.




How do we share news and communicate information?








Farewells
