Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day was celebrated on 11th November and is a day to remember people who fought and died in wars or other conflicts across the world. On November 11th 1918 on the 11th hour of the 11th day or the 11th month the First World War ended.



Poppies are worn on Remembrance day (and days leading up to) as a sign of remembrance for those people who died during this war and any other that followed. The poppy was chosen as a symbol as it began to grow freely on the battlefields where service men died.

Last week, some children from year 1 and all of year 2 visited the Uxbridge Memorial to lay their

handcrafted poppy wreaths.

Anti-Bullying Week

Monday 14th - Friday 18th November 2022

Every November schools throughout the United Kingdom take part in Anti-Bullying Week.

This is an opportunity to spotlight bullying and consider the steps we can take together to stop it.

The theme this year is 'Reach Out'.

In school, children will learn about what bullying is and what to do if they think they or someone else is being bullied.

Our behaviour policy states:

'Bullying of any kind is unacceptable at Whitehall Infant School. If bullying behaviour does occur all children and adults should be able to tell and know that all incidents will be dealt with promptly and effectively. We believe that ignoring bullying is wrong'

At Whitehall Infant School, we define bullying as any or all of the following:

- A repetitive series of actions by an individual or group which causes long lasting fear, anxiety or harm to another person or group of people
- Repetitive verbal or physical actions which as designed to intentionally hurt and intimidate or to make the person who is at the receiving end feel unhappy, embarrassed or insecure about themselves.
- Bullying can take place online and is not always in person.

As a parent or carer, you are a vital piece of the puzzle in tackling bullying. You have a unique role to play in guiding and supporting your child through their school years and there are many positive steps you can take to help keep your child safe from bullying and harm.


One of the steps is knowing when to ask for support.

Applying for Nursery School

For children due to start Nursery in September 2023, you must apply direct to the school. If your child's date of birth falls between 1st September 2022 and 31st August 2023 and they turn 3, then you can apply for entry in September 2023. Attendance

Every school day counts.

Young children will be more likely to get minor illnesses as their immunity is building up. Attendance in schools is tracked daily and has to be reported to the local authority. Children whose attendance falls below 90% are categorised as being **Persistent Absentees**. Absence includes <u>all days off school</u> for illness or other reasons.

Please try and book appointments where possible out of school hours. Avoid having any term time holidays. The school's Attendance policy can be found on our website. It has all the information you need.

We celebrate weekly attendance heroes in our Friday Gold Book assemblies. All children who have been at school that week have their names in a draw and each year group has winners.

Punctuality

You will agree that poor punctuality is not to be ignored. At Whitehall the children have a lovely welcome into school and then go onto their phonics lessons. These lessons are grouped according to reading ability therefore most children will not be with their own teacher but in smaller groups across school.

Each morning office staff and myself, Mrs Kennedy, Mrs Malik, Mrs Williams, Mrs Ferdous, Miss Woolley, Mrs Ferrell and other staff take children who are late to their class. This is not a good use of our time.

We will be calling parents who are regularly late to meetings to discuss what can be done to improve punctuality. Occasionally anyone can be delayed. The children who are coming in late are missing valuable settling in time and learning time.

Please come and speak to one of the staff on duty if you would like some support with getting your child to school on time or any other difficulties which are effecting your child's attendance/punctuality

We have reward charts ready and will support you with ideas about morning routines.

Regularly clean frequently touched surfaces and shared rooms like kitchens and bathrooms.






Get help where possible from those
