Shrove Tuesday and Lent

Shrove Tuesday is a Christian festival celebrated in many countries across the world. Christians also refer to Shrove Tuesday as Pancake Day! Pancakes are made with 'luxury' ingredients such as flour and eggs that Christians would traditionally use up before the beginning of Lent - a period of around six weeks leading up to Easter.

During Lent, Christians give up something to remember when Jesus went into the desert for 40 days to fast and pray.

In school, we learn about Shrove Tuesday and Lent as part of our social, moral, spiritual and cultural learning, RE curriculum and Understanding of the World area of learning in the Early Years. We saw how pancakes are made and tried some in school last week.
